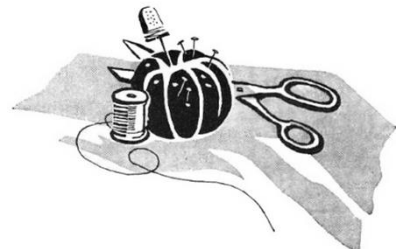

Tips on Showing:

1. The entry fee is \$5.00 per person. There is no charge for Youth Class 74.
2. Each entry must have a completed entry tag attached. The Fair Office will be open starting Monday, October 2, contact us, 905-265-1782, if you want to pick up entry forms and/or tags before Monday.
3. All entries along with completed entry forms must be submitted by **12:00 NOON on WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 4, 2023. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE RECEIVED PAST NOON OCTOBER 4, 2023.**
4. Exhibitors are to pick up their entries at the Coates Arts & Crafts Building on Monday, October 9 **BEGINNING NO EARLIER THAN 6:00 pm**, when the building closes. Speak to the Secretaries to make alternate arrangements.
5. All Quilts entered for Championship, must be a minimum of 324" perimeter.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Show only what is specified or it could be disqualified.
- No prizes for Soiled or Damaged articles. Wearing apparel may have been worn but must be clean.
- Seams of fabric should be pressed, with overcast or pinked edges.
- Weave ends of yarn together and if you must knot, join at the seams of knit or crochet articles.
- No prize for an item if it has been exhibited in the past 2 years.
- All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
- Exhibitors are allowed one entry only in each section number.
- Standard Size for Reference
 - Twin: Bed 38" x 75" Quilt 80" x 108"
 - Double: Bed 54" x 75" Quilt 96" x 108"
 - Queen: Bed 60" x 80" Quilt 102" x 113"



ONTARIO ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT COMPETITION



GENERAL RULES

1. The quilt must be solely made and quilted (machine or hand) by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies to be eligible for this competition.
2. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement.
3. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame. The quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.
4. The winning OAAS quilt (machine or hand) will not be eligible to compete in any further OAAS district and/or provincial competitions.
5. The winning exhibitor's name and quilt pattern will be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules.
6. The use of domestic, mid arm and/or long arm equipment is permitted on hand or computer guided machine quilt entries.
7. Judging will occur at local fairs and District levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual Convention of OAAS.
8. Upon making an entry into the OAAS Quilt Competition, the exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.

LOCAL COMPETITIONS

1. Each local fair is entitled to send their Best of Show (or Grand Champion) of all eligible machine or hand quilts to the district competition.
2. If the fair's Best of Show hand or machine quilt classes has won at more than one fair, the exhibitor must consider their own agricultural society as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the district meeting, otherwise it should be sent from the agricultural society nearest their home address. The other fairs at which this quilt was entered and won, may enter their second Best of Show (Reserve Grand Champion) quilt in the district competition.
3. An exhibitor who wins more than one Best of Show title with a different quilt at different fairs shall be entitled to enter each winning quilt to compete at the District competitions.
4. Local Homecraft Divisions are requested to judge a Best of Show (Grand Champion) of all ELIGIBLE quilts. As well as 2nd Best of Show (Reserve Grand Champion) of all ELIGIBLE quilts.

CLASS 70 A: HAND QUILTING; large items

Articles must not be older than two years.

If applicable, the name of the quilt pattern must be included on the entry tag. All quilts in sections 1 to 6 must be a minimum 72" x 90". Quilts in sections 1 to 4 that measure a minimum of 324" perimeter are eligible for the OAAS Competition.

Sections

1. Quilt, Traditional design , only-pieced	A
2. Quilt, Traditional design – applique only	A
3. Quilt, Mixed – pieced, applique, embroidered, painted etc.	A
4. Quilt, Any Design – judged on hand quilting only	
5. Quilt, Open Class – must be quilted by an organization, name and address of an Officer of the organization must be included (not eligible for OAAS Competition)	A
6. Quilt, Any Pattern, Tied (not eligible for OAAS Competition)	A

CLASS 70 B: HAND QUILTING; small items

Sections

1. Mini Quilt , no larger than 80" with block sizes no larger than 3"	B
2. Pieced Wall Hanging , total perimeter of 190"	B
3. Child's Car Seat Quilt , minimum 2' x 3'	B
4. Single bed Quilt	B
5. One Quilt Block Face , pieced, mounted and named – not quilted, 12.5 "x 12.5"	B

6. An Article of Clothing with quilted aspect.	B

CLASS 70 C: MACHINE QUILTED; large and small

Articles must not be older than two years.

If applicable, the name of the quilt pattern must be included on the entry tag. Quilts in section 1 must be a minimum of 324" perimeter to be eligible for the OAAS Competition.

Sections

1. Pieced Quilt , name of pattern must be included	B
2. Quilted Wall Hanging , total perimeter of 190"	B
3. Pieced Lap Quilt , minimum 3' x 5'	B
4. Quilted Pillowcase , any shape	B
5. Quilt for a single bed (38" x 74.5")	B



CLASS 70 D: MIXED QUILTED

To qualify entries must include both hand and machine quilting techniques. Can be pieced and/or applique.

Articles must not be older than two years. If applicable, the name of the quilt pattern must be included on the entry tag.

Sections

1. Wall Hanging, Quilted Picture with an autumn or harvest theme	A
2. Pillowcase in fall colours, any shape	A

Please Note: entries in this class can be made by the student or by a schoolteacher on their behalf.

- The hand drawn poster must clearly show the name, dates, and theme of the fair.
- Poster Size:
 - Minimum 22cm x 28cm without border
 - Maximum 28cm x 44cm without border
- Entries must be centered on a cardstock or Bristol board backing exposing a 5.5 cm border on all four sides.
- Name of fair, district (#5), contact person, owner of poster to be clearly labeled on the back.
- The 1st place poster becomes the property of the Woodbridge Fair Board and may be used in the Fair's promotional advertising
- The winning poster will be eligible to enter the district competition. District winner will be eligible to enter at the provincial competition

Judging Standards:

- Overall Appearance – 50 points
 - Fair name, dates & theme clear
- Creativity & Design – 35 points
 - Attracts and holds attention
- OAAS Criteria – 15 points
 - Size, material, theme
